

## **NOTICE**

### **(As received from the University)**

The fifth cut-off list (B.Com) dated 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (Eve) with typographical error was uploaded on the University website on 17<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 (night) and withdrawn on 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 by 11.00 a.m. This inadvertent human error created confusion amongst the applicants and corrigendum was issued and uploaded on the website of the University and that of the college well before the actual round of admission began at 4.00 pm in the evening on 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2017.

A factual report dated 20<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 on the issue was received from the Principal, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (Eve). As per the report, the college had informed the applicants/parents who came in the morning of 18<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 to seek admission on the basis of mistaken percentage, that it was purely human error which they understood and left. However, in the afternoon, the Principal reported that some miscreants tried to break the lock of the office and instigated a few parents to break the office gate. The SHO of Police Station, Malviya Nagar and ACP Hauz Khas, who were instrumental in bringing the situation under control, also explained to them that it was unintentional human error and the College had taken sufficient corrective steps.

Further, it was also reported by the Principal that admission of some students who had got their confirmed admissions cancelled from other colleges was also restored with the assistance of OSD Admissions and Principals of the respective colleges.

In the meantime, a grievance from parents/applicants dated 19<sup>th</sup> July, 2017 was received by the University with respect to issues arising out of the said error in the cut-off. The percentages of the applicants in the grievance ranged from 79.25% to 87%, which is below the cut-off percentage, i.e., 90%. Accordingly, these applicants cannot be given admission as per fifth cut-off list.

In view of the above, no grievance is left to be addressed on this issue as on date.
