The Placement Cell SBSEC was founded in the year 2014-15 with the goal to provide employment & internship opportunities to the students of the college in some of the reputed organizations. It acts as an interface between the industry and the students to enable them to select their career path.

The activities and achievements of the cell in the academic year 2020-21 are as follows:

- More than 120 students were placed where Gross Value of Employment Generated in the academic session 2020-21 by the Cell was INR 8.4 Crore. Companies have shown willingness to offer a package as high as INR 21,00,000 per annum to our students.
- During the year, more than 130 students were able to secure internships via the Placement Cell. The average stipend of the year 2020-21 stands at Rs. 4000.00 p.m. whereas the highest stipend offered is Rs. 10,000.00 p.m.
- The Orientation session was conducted by the Placement Coordinators. Placement guidelines, processes and policies were thoroughly discussed along with the brochure and report of the previous academic year.
- CV building workshop was conducted by the officials of the well-known organization, “CV Owl” who focused on the basics of resume formation.
- Also, Experienced Talks is a series of videos available at the official Instagram handle of The Placement Cell, SBSEC that unveils stories and experiences of the students who secured placements
- Achievers Speak is one of the flagship initiatives by The Placement Cell SBSEC to invite students from within the college or other colleges across Delhi University to share their experience of cracking highly competitive entrance Exams.
- To prepare students for the extremely competitive Job interviews and exams, The Placement Cell conducted a Training Session by IIM Alumnus PrepJunction.
- Moreover, the Cell collaborated with Google and Josh Talks to register the institute with the Google powered initiative “Kormo Jobs”.
- Admit PRO participated to impart the positives and negatives about pursuing further education abroad clearing all the doubts related to expenses, application processes, living standards of life and ROI.
- The Placement Cell SBSEC in collaboration with Younity.in conducted an online webinar on the topic – “How to crack Internships amidst the Pandemic?”
- The Cell conducted its CV Vetting Drive for the first time to formalize processes for the Campus Placements.
